

## Energy Rebates Created Just for Nonprofits

Evergy's Energy Efficiency for Nonprofits Program is designed to help organizations like yours lower energy costs and increase comfort for the people you serve. By increasing your energy efficiency, you'll have greater control over costs and be able to redirect valuable resources toward what matters most—your mission.



### WHO QUALIFIES FOR THIS PROGRAM?

Nonprofit, 501(c)(3) organizations that primarily provide lodging and social services to low-income, homeless or at-risk populations can receive incentives to make energy-efficient improvements.\* Upgrades can include:

- ▶ HVAC replacements
- ▶ ENERGY STAR® certified appliances
- ▶ FREE energy assessment to identify energy efficiency opportunities
- ▶ Installation of FREE LEDs, showerheads, faucet aerators, HVAC tuneups and more



### REBATE AMOUNTS

Increased rebates are offered for all existing Business Standard Rebates<sup>†</sup> for any of your commercial equipment needs, not to exceed the upgrade cost. For example, increased rebates are available for commercial refrigeration equipment, HVAC systems and more. However, if your buildings are more like a residential home, Residential Rebates are also available. For example, rebates are available ranging from \$50 to \$200 for residential-style refrigerators, washers, dryers and more.

\* The organization operating the facility must be able to prove its federal 501(c)(3) status. Facility must be a homeless shelter, women's shelter, emergency shelter and/or group living facility. Satellite facilities (facilities associated with the headquarters) in the name of the licensed organization are also eligible.

<sup>†</sup> Rebates cannot exceed the cost of the equipment. To be eligible, your organization must have Evergy electric service and be a Missouri 501(c)(3) that fits the shelter criteria listed above.



## REFRIGERATOR EXAMPLE

A women's shelter plans to replace its 10-year-old commercial-grade reach-in refrigerator with a new ENERGY STAR certified model that's on average 20% more energy efficient than standard models.

- ▶ Energy savings: 286 kWh
- ▶ Cost savings: \$30 per year
- ▶ Rebate: \$220



## DISHWASHER EXAMPLE

A day shelter is replacing a 10-year-old residential dishwasher in its employee break room with an ENERGY STAR certified dishwasher. The ENERGY STAR model is on average 5% more energy efficient and 15% more water efficient than standard models—saving an average of 3,870 gallons of water over its lifetime.

- ▶ Energy savings: 270 kWh
- ▶ Cost savings: \$30 per year
- ▶ Rebate: \$50



## HEAT PUMP EXAMPLE

A 24-unit group home plans to replace all its air conditioners with high-efficiency heat pumps.

- ▶ Energy savings: 19,404 kWh
- ▶ Cost savings: \$1,400 per year
- ▶ Rebate: \$14,400 (assumes 24, 4-ton units)
